Sir;

The Prefect of the adjoining county in Sonora sent a verbal message to me while in command of this Fort (during the sickness of Maj: Fitzgerald) to the effect that Pablo Malendrey, a New Mexican from somewhere about Douglas had bought a Mexican captive from the Indians - It seems while on the road to N. M. with a train he met some Apaches with a captive Mexican woman and her child, which latter he bought, leaving the Mother in spite of her entreaties in the hands of the Indians, although they offered to sell her for a few blankets.

This report was brought by two Mexicans who belong to Sonora and at the time were employed by Malendrey - I promised to do all I could in the premises and have the honor to request you to lay the matter before the Governor of N. M. as it is understood that Malendrey bought the
